

Information of important matters

1. Coverage options

Personal reparations: **unlimited**



Property damage liability insurance: **unlimited**



Personal injury insurance:

Driver & Passengers:

- **Up to 5 million yen per person**
(Applicable for only severe injuries)
- **5,000 yen per day for hospitalization**
- **2,500 yen per day for outpatient treatment**



Passenger Injury Coverage (Hospitalization/Outpatient Visits) Rider

If you or your passengers are injured while driving, this policy provides compensation. In the event of an accident involving the insured vehicle, if the named insured or passengers require medical treatment within 180 days of the accident, the following amounts will be paid as medical insurance benefits for each insured person:

- **Hospitalization:** A daily hospitalization benefit for each day of hospitalization.
- **Outpatient Visits:** A daily outpatient benefit for each day of outpatient treatment (up to 90 days).

Passenger Injury (Death/Disability) Coverage

In the unfortunate event of death or severe disability due to an accident, insurance benefits will be provided. If an accident occurs while riding in the insured vehicle and results in death or disability within 180 days from the date of the accident, the policy will pay out death benefits or disability benefits accordingly.

2. The cases which are not covered by insurance

- When you **don't report** the accident to **the police**
- Accidents caused by people who **didn't request** at the time of departure
- Accidents caused by **unlicensed** driving
- Accidents caused by driving **under the influence of alcohol**
- When you **breach the rental agree agreement**

3. In the case of a traffic accident

- Check if there are people who can speak Japanese

YES ⇒ Ask them to **help** you

NO ⇒ Try to do the following things by yourself!

- Check if there are any injured people

YES⇒ Please call **119** when you need an **ambulance** service



1. Tell the dispatcher you are in a medical emergency
2. Tell the operator the location of the emergency
3. If you do not know the address, describe a nearby building or intersection as a landmark
4. Tell the symptoms of injured people
5. Tell your age
6. Tell your name and contact details
7. Call 110

NO ⇒ Please call **110 (police)**



4. If the car stops working...

Please check the following things first

1. Is the **parking brake** released until it touches the floor?
2. Do you **grip the brakes** unconsciously?
3. Is the shift switch **neutral position**?
4. Is the **brake rock** still applied?

5. The important point when you drive in Japan

Crosswalk

In Japan **pedestrians have the right of way**, so you **must stop** when there are people who want to cross the crosswalk.

Way

Cars are driven on **the left side** of the road in Japan.

Stop

Stop signs don't always look the same, though the standard is an upside down red triangle.

The most important thing to look for is the Japanese word “**止まれ**,” which means stop.

In many cases the word is painted in white on the ground and no sign is used.

Signal

Traffic lights are standard in Japan: green for go, yellow for prepare, and red for stop.

Railroad crossing

All drivers are required to stop and look both ways for a train before proceeding through the crossing
